SAFETY CONCERN - Parents of elementary students, please remember that as school is dismissed students may not go in between or in front/behind cars without **being escorted by a parent or adult**.

SURE START, KINDERGARTEN & 1ST GRADE ENTRANCE AGE CUT-OFF: Effective for School Year 2009-2010, DoDEA schools will implement a change in the entrance age cut-off date for Early Childhood Education Programs. Regulation is as follows:

- A child must be 4 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend the DoDEA Sure Start Program and Pre-Kindergarten Program.
- A child must be 5 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend Kindergarten in DoDEA Schools.

- A child must be 6 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend first grade in DoDEA Schools.

NAEP TESTING of 4th & 8th GRADE STUDENTS - All 4th and 8th grade students in all DoDDS Schools will take the NAEP (*National Assessment of Educational Progress*) exam during the month of February. Lajes Fourth graders will test on February 24. Eighth graders will test on February 25. An explanatory letter will be sent home to parents of Fourth and Eighth graders in early February providing parents with more detailed information about NAEP testing. Lajes Commissary DECA Scholarship- The deadline for eligible seniors to submit a completed application and essay for the 2009 DECA Scholarship (worth **\$1500**) is February 18th. HONOR SOCIETY: - Now that the first semester of SY2008-9 is over, the Lajes American School Chapter of the National Honor Society and National Junior Honor Society will be starting the process of extending membership invitations to selected students.

The Society is comprised of students (grades 7-9 for NJHS and grades 10-12 for NHS) who exemplify in their personal and academic lives the attributes valued by the National Honor Society and Lajes American School. These attributes are:

- I. Character. NHS and NJHS candidates are expected to demonstrate and maintain the highest standards of character.
- II. Scholarship. Students must achieve a cumulative GPA of 3.4 based solely on their record at LAS. Students must also have attended LAS for at least six months.
- III. Leadership. Students must demonstrate the ability to promote positive leadership in their school and community. NHS candidates must have leadership experience in at least three activities, NJHS candidates must have one.
- IV. Service. Our NHS inductees must have been involved in at least three school or community service-related projects within the past three years. NJHS candidates must have completed one such project.

The goal of our Society is "to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character in the students of secondary schools." Questions about NHS or NJHS may be directed the Society's advisor.

AIR FORCE AID SOCIETY GRANT PROGRAM - Air Force Parents take heart! There is college money out there for your son/daughter. The Air Force Aid Society has a Grant Program in place that will provide \$2000 in grant money per year for a total of \$8000 over four years. To be eligible for this grant (which is free money) for the 2009-1010 academic year, the applicant must be the dependent of an Air Force sponsor, will be a high school graduate enrolled or accepted into a full-time undergraduate college level program, and maintain a 2.0 grade point average (GPA).
