SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS (SIP) - What is SIP? SIP is a critical part of our school's accreditation process. To be accredited by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement, we work toward improving our school on a five-year cycle. Last year we began implementing the activities, and the process continues in this, the third year of the cycle.

SURE START, KINDERGARTEN & 1ST GRADE ENTRANCE AGE CUT-OFF: Effective for School Year 2009-2010, DoDEA schools will implement a change in the entrance age cut-off date for Early Childhood Education Programs. Regulation is as follows:

- A child must be 4 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend the DoDEA Sure Start Program and Pre-Kindergarten Program.
- A child must be 5 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend Kindergarten in DoDEA Schools.

- A child must be 6 years of age by September 1 to be eligible to attend first grade in DoDEA Schools.

REMINDER! REMINDER! - Parents please update your emergency phone numbers and emergency contacts so that we are able to contact you should an emergency situation occur.

HONOR SOCIETY: - Now that the first semester of SY2008-9 is over, the Lajes American School Chapter of the National Honor Society and National Junior Honor Society will be starting the process of extending membership invitations to selected students.

The Society is comprised of students (grades 7-9 for NJHS and grades 10-12 for NHS) who exemplify in their personal and academic lives the attributes valued by the National Honor Society and Lajes American School. These attributes are:

- I. Character. NHS and NJHS candidates are expected to demonstrate and maintain the highest standards of character.
- II. Scholarship. Students must achieve a cumulative GPA of 3.4 based solely on their record at LAS. Students must also have attended LAS for at least six months.
- III. Leadership. Students must demonstrate the ability to promote positive leadership in their school and community. NHS candidates must have leadership experience in at least three activities, NJHS candidates must have one.
- IV. Service. Our NHS inductees must have been involved in at least three school or community service-related projects within the past three years. NJHS candidates must have completed one such project.

The goal of our Society is "to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character in the students of secondary schools." Questions about NHS or NJHS may be directed the Society's advisor.
